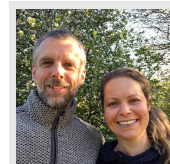
A dramatic woodland with a deep central valley, surrounded by bluebells in spring.

Description

A compact woodland between and above the A20 and M20 in an easy to reach part of Kent where there are many intriguing features. The soil is very sandy and free-draining - in places the sand has been extracted leaving a shallow quarry.

Trees

Much mature western red cedar, a plantation of bird cherry, widespread silver birch, some sycamore and occasional sweet chestnut. Several oaks including at the centre a magnificent veteran oak and the odd ash. As with all ancient trees care should be taken when standing below!

Wildlife

Parts are PAWS (plantation on ancient woodland sites), other areas are ancient and semi-natural woodland and in spring have a wonderful display of bluebells.

This wood and others nearby are designated as a local wildlife site, this does not confer any public access but describes the value for wildlife and conservation. Click here for details [LWS](#).

Features

At the centre is a dramatic valley, ridges to the north and south enclose it, making this a rather private area. A bench close to this track is a perfect place to stop and enjoy the surroundings.

Access, tracks and footpaths

Access is off the A20 through a metal gate, there is a track running up a slope fronting the south and eastern side of the wood.

Rights and covenants

The purchasers of the woodland will be asked to enter into a [covenant](#) to ensure the quiet and peaceful enjoyment of adjoining woodlands and meadows.

Activities

Forestry, with lots of different tree species, camping, brush crafts, wildlife photography are just some of the potential pursuits here.

Local area and history

Monkwood Wood is in what were the lands of the Leeds Castle Estate, now in private ownership much of the forested land having been separated from the estate.

How to find this woodland

You are welcome to visit this wood by yourself, but please ensure that you have a copy of these sales details with you - many of our woodlands do not have mobile phone reception or internet access so we recommend either printing the details or downloading them to your phone/tablet/laptop.

Do remember to also check that it is still available for sale. If you have seen the woodland and wish to be accompanied on a second more detailed visit please contact our local manager.

Directions

Monkwood at Leeds Castle is about 10 mins east of Maidstone and 2 miles west of Harrietsham.

1. [Click here for Bing Maps Directions](#) enter your own postcode, (the coordinates for the wooden entrance gate are already entered) and click on the "Go" box to get your route.

2. **For Satnav:** the nearest postcode is **ME17 1PZ** on the A20 almost opposite the gated entrance as shown by the red dot on the maps.

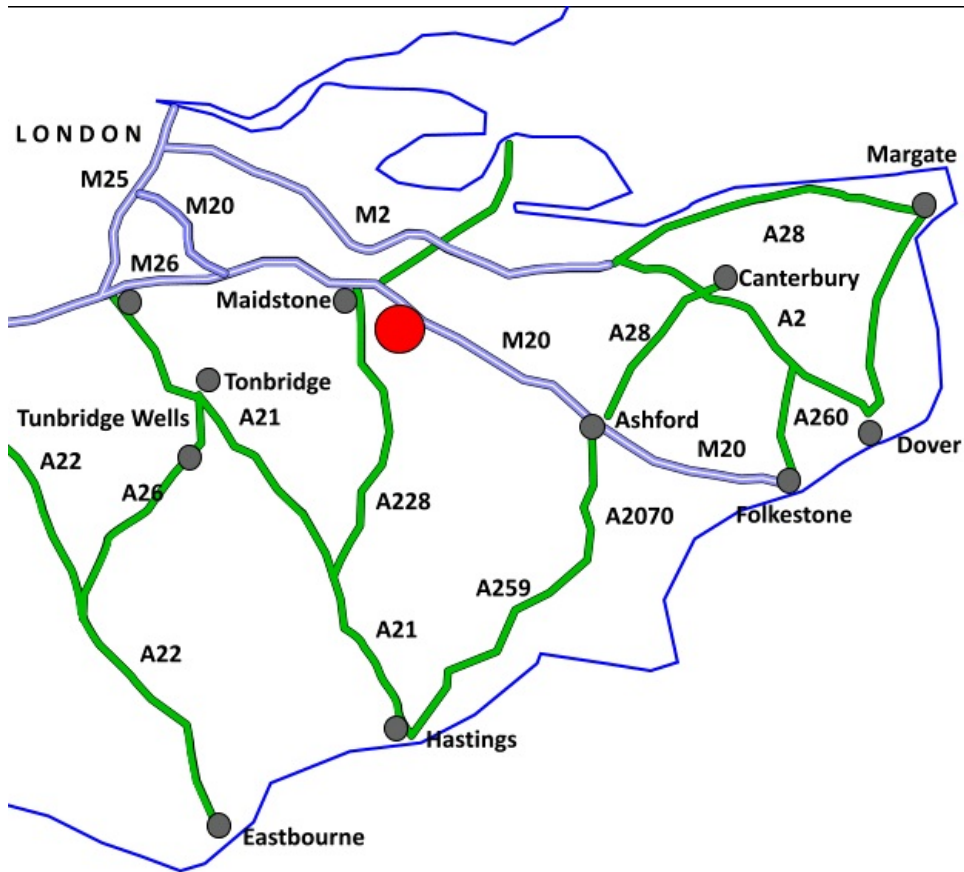
The simplest place to park is just north of the entrance in the layby. Please park to one end of the layby as this is also a bus stop.

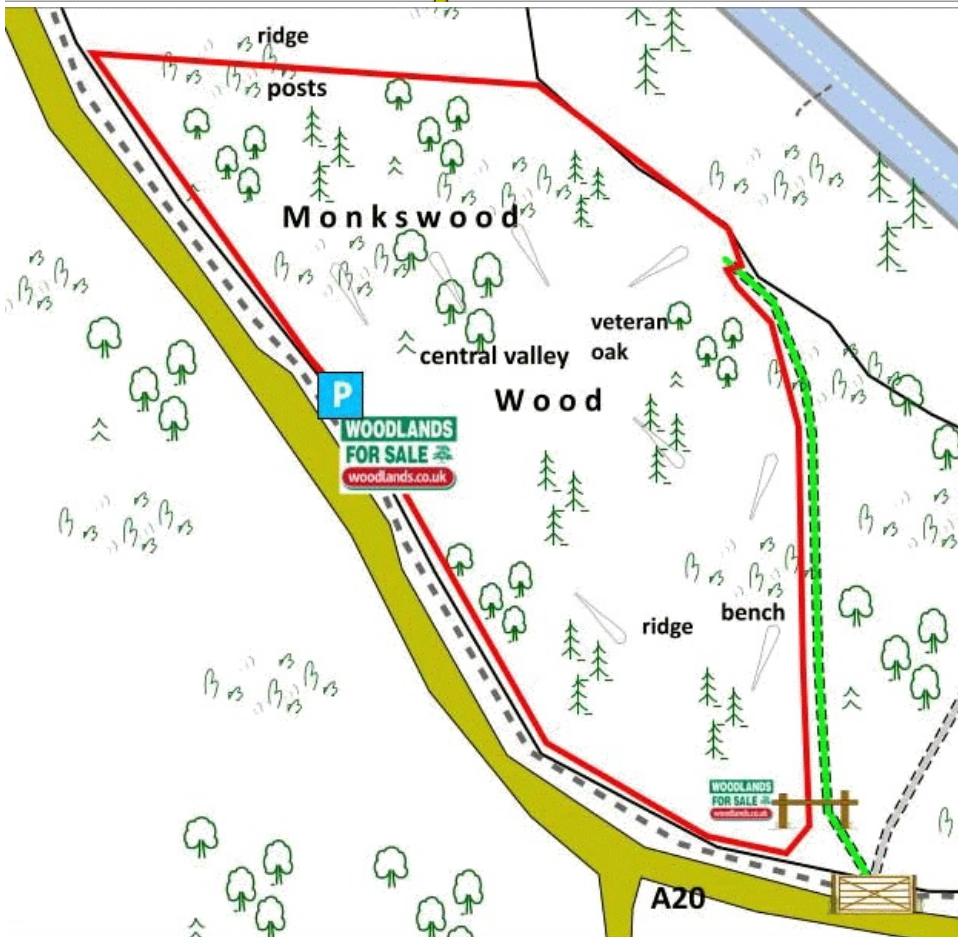
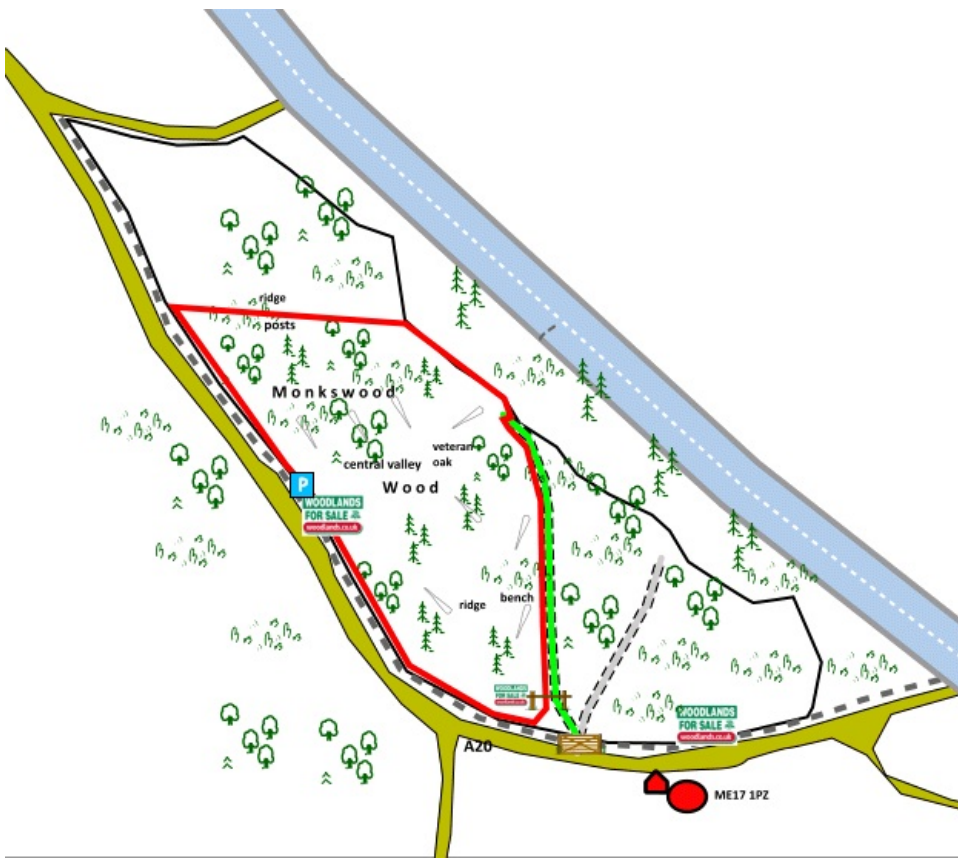
Climb or squeeze past the red metal gate, follow the track around to the left and Monkwood is ahead.

Boundaries:

These are shown by red markings on free-standing stakes to the north, a fence to the east, the trackside to the south and east and the A20 to the west.
