Description

Barton Meadow offers an opportunity for those seeking a peaceful parcel of land with a strong connection to nature. Charming views can be enjoyed from the meadow across rolling hills and neighbouring farmland, extending south towards the popular Dartmoor National Park.

The location and features of this meadow make it ideal for private amenity use, tree planting, and other conservation-focused projects. There are numerous tree planting grants readily available, offering financial support for woodland creation projects. This ideal setting is perfect for those looking to contribute to local biodiversity while enjoying a private retreat. It is locatred only 15 minutes away from the historic town of Okehampton, with Exeter under an hour to the east, and the coastal town of Bude only a 50 minute drive to the west.

For camping enthusiasts, the meadow offers convenient access and parking for cars, medium-sized campervans, or caravans. Entry from the secured north access gate via the public highway leads you along a stone track to a sturdy private hardstanding area, offering convenience and flexibility for campers and caravanners to enjoy the peaceful environment.

You will enter Barton Meadow via the shared access track that leads through the northwest corner of the boundary line. Upon entry, a moderate gradient gradually levels out as you proceed southwards along the track, eventually reaching the meadow's southern boundary, composed of a mature hedgerow.

The moderate slope facilitates rainwater drainage, creating optimal conditions for tree planting activities. The western boundary follows the inner edge of the shared access track and is sheltered by a mature hedgerow. From this vantage point, the land extends eastward in a broadly square shape. The other three boundaries are defined by mature hedgerows containing a mix of shrubs, bushes, and occasional trees. In the summer months, these hedgerows offer the added bonus of wild berries.

A public footpath runs the length of the northern boundary, as highlighted on the wood map. This footpath begins at the northeast corner, where it enters the meadow by crossing a stile and continues along the northern boundary until it reaches another stile at the northwest corner of the meadow.

Surrounded by mature hedgerows and scattered broadleaf trees, the meadow serves as a sanctuary for deer, rabbits, and various bird species, such as buzzards, owls, and pheasants. These hedgerows also offer food and shelter for numerous smaller birds, acting as natural seed banks to promote natural regeneration and support tree planting efforts.

Barton Meadow is a lush parcel of land, rich in character and offering beautiful views in a sought-after location in the Devon countryside. It presents a unique opportunity for its next custodian to create a lasting legacy.

The purchasers of the meadow will be asked to enter into a <u>covenant</u> to ensure the quiet and peaceful enjoyment of adjoining woodlands and meadows.

Wildlife

The meadow is teeming with life, featuring numerous birds such as buzzards, owls, pheasants, and smaller songbirds, all in search of food and shelter within the hedgerows. Rabbits and deer also make frequent visits, leaving their distinct tracks visible upon close inspection of the hedges.

Barton Meadow comes with freehold title and there is a public footpath which runs along the northern boundary of the meadow, which is used very occasionally. The land is accessed through a secured gate via a stoned track from the public highway.


In terms of finding the meadow, when heading from Okehampton direction, follow Northlew Rd heading west for 4 miles. Look out for a turning on your left-hand side signposted for Ashbury and turn left there onto Waterhouse Hill. Follow this single track road for about a ½ mile and on your left hand side, you will see a metal gate with a Woodlands.co.uk sign (Tree Planting Land). Park safely at the gate carefully climb over the padlocked gate and follow the stone track for approx. 400 metres. Barton Meadow is on the left side of the track and is identified by a purple coloured name plate.


Northern: Mature hedgerow
