Wildlife

The cover crop currently sewn on the land makes it a haven for birds, pollinators and other wildlife. Game birds are a regular sight on the land along with deer, which venture out from the neighbouring woodland.

The land is accessed via a stoned track from the public highway. There are no public rights of way across the land.

Local area and history

Fowey, a historic port town in Cornwall, has a rich maritime history dating back to the Middle Ages. Established as a trading and fishing hub, it became prominent in the 14th century, providing ships for the English crown. The town played a key role during the Hundred Years' War, with privateers known as the "Fowey Gallants" defending the coast against French attacks. Fowey's strategic importance continued through the centuries, witnessing naval skirmishes and thriving as a commercial port.

How to find this meadow

Directions

Castle Meadow is accessed via a stoned track from the public highway near the village of Lanteglos Highway, Cornwall. Fowey is around 10 minutes away by car, with Liskeard around a 20 minute drive away to the north east.

Click here for Google Maps directions. Enter your own postcode, (the location coordinates are already entered), and click on the "Directions" box. This will take you to the roadside gate where the track begins, where you can park just inside the gate on the hardstanding. The main gate is marked by a "Tree Planting Land" sign. Thereafter, please carefully climb the second gate directly in front of you and follow the track up in front of you until the end, where the entrance to the meadow is through the hedgerow on your right hand side.

Satnav: the postcode **PL23 1NE** is the nearest to Castle Meadow, but please note it will take you slightly to the north of the main gate. Please see the "wood maps" image which shows this.

Coordinates for satnav are: 50.347777, -4.608149 for the metal gates at the start of the access track.

Directions:

When heading south on the B3359, turn right at the signposts to Fowey, Polruan, Bodinnick and Lerryn. Follow this road all the way to Lanteglos Highway which has a "welcome to" sign on the left hand verge. Drive past the collection of houses on your left hand side, around 20 or so, before taking the left hand turn after the last house. Follow for a couple of hundred metres before following to the right where there is a slight fork in the road. Turn left down the hill at the next junction you encounter. Follow for around 500 metres and the main entrance gate will be on your left hand side.


Eastern: Stakes
